Summary

This sermon focuses on Exodus 18 and the theme that 'Our God is a life changer.' The pastor explores how God transformed Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, from a pagan priest to a believer in the one true God. The sermon also discusses how God continues to change both non-believers and believers, using personal examples including the conversion story of the pastor's aunt Janet.

The message emphasizes that while we aren't called to be saviors, we are called to be reporters of God's good news. The sermon concludes by highlighting how God changed Moses from a stubborn leader to someone willing to accept counsel, demonstrating that God continues to transform believers throughout their lives.

- 7. How can we maintain hope when praying for someone's conversion over a long period?
- 8. What practical steps can we take to be more open to God's transformative work in our lives?

This week, identify one area in your life where you need God's transformative power. Commit to praying specifically about this area each day, and look for opportunities to share with at least one person how God has already changed your life.
