Summary

This sermon focuses on the Transfiguration of Jesus as recorded in Mark 9:2-10. The pastor explains how Jesus took Peter, James, and John up a mountain where they witnessed His divine glory revealed, with His clothes becoming dazzling white and His face shining like the sun. Moses and Elijah appeared with Jesus, and God's voice declared 'This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him.' The sermon emphasizes three main points about the Transfiguration: it confirmed Jesus' deity, established Him as the way of salvation, and provided a preview of His second coming and our future glorified bodies.
