Summary

The sermon focuses on Exodus 32, where the Israelites, during Moses' 40-day absence on Mount Sinai, abandon their commitment to God and create a golden calf idol to worship. Despite witnessing God's miraculous deliverance from Egypt and His continued presence, they grew impatient and turned to idolatry under Aaron's leadership. The story illustrates the deceitfulness of the human heart and our tendency to turn away from God when we stop trusting Him.

- 4. In what ways do people today create modern 'golden calves' in their lives?
- 5. What does it mean to 'guard your heart' in practical terms?
- 6. Why do we sometimes try to hide or minimize our sins instead of confessing them?
- 7. How does the Holy Spirit help us in our battle against our sinful nature?
- 8. What steps can we take to maintain trust in God during periods of waiting?

Life Application

This week, take time each day to examine your heart and identify any 'idols' that may be taking God's rightful place in your life. Write these down and pray specifically about surrendering them to God. If you identify any unconfessed sin, take immediate steps to confess it to God and, if necessary, make things right with others.
