

Summary

In this sermon, Pastor Mike explores the concept of being 'born again' through Jesus' conversation with Nicodemus in John 3:1-8. He explains that being born again means being remade by the power of God - washed clean of sin through Jesus' blood and transformed from the inside out by the Holy Spirit. This spiritual rebirth is not about external changes but an internal transformation that gives us a new nature and purpose.

The pastor emphasizes that being born again is the only way to enter the Kingdom of God, both in terms of having a personal relationship with God now and eternal life in heaven later. He clarifies that everyone needs this spiritual rebirth, regardless of their status or religiosity, and that it comes only through God's grace, not through our own efforts. The sermon concludes with an invitation for listeners to surrender their lives to Christ and experience this spiritual transformation.

Questions

1. What does it mean to be 'born again' according to the sermon? How would you explain this concept to someone who has never heard it before?
2. Pastor Mike said, 'To be born again is to be remade by the power of God.' How is this different from simply trying to change ourselves through our own efforts?

3. The sermon mentions being 'born of water and the Spirit.' What does each of these elements represent in the spiritual rebirth process?
4. Why do you think Nicodemus, despite being religiously educated and morally upright, still needed to be born again? What does this teach us?
5. How does the pastor's explanation of the Kingdom of God having both present and future aspects help you understand what it means to follow Christ?
6. The sermon states that when we're born again, Jesus takes the throne of our hearts. What areas of your life might you still be keeping control of rather than surrendering to Christ?
7. How would you respond to someone who believes there's a difference between being a Christian and being 'born again'?
8. Pastor Mike used the wind as an analogy for the Holy Spirit's work in our lives. What evidence of the Spirit's work have you seen in your life or in others' lives?

Life Application

This week, take time to reflect on your spiritual birth story. If you've been born again, write down your testimony of how Christ transformed you and be prepared to share it with someone who needs to hear it. If you're not sure whether you've experienced spiritual rebirth, commit to speaking with a mature Christian about your questions and what it means to surrender your life fully to Christ. For all of us, identify one area where you're still trying to change yourself from the outside in rather than allowing God's Spirit to transform you from the inside out, and surrender that area to God in daily prayer.

Key Takeaways
