### **Summary**

This sermon explores what it means to be a 'child of God' from a theological perspective, focusing on the concept of adoption into God's family. The pastor explains that when someone becomes a Christian, they receive a new nature (regeneration), new standing (justification), and a new position (adoption) in God's family. He emphasizes that God has no grandchildren - only children - meaning each person must personally accept Jesus Christ rather than relying on their family's faith. The message addresses how believers can live as children of God by stopping hatred toward their earthly family and abandoning a slave mentality in favor of understanding their true identity as beloved, chosen children of their heavenly Father.

### **Intro Prayer**

Heavenly Father, we come before You today with open hearts, ready to learn what it means to be Your children. We ask that You would speak to each person here according to their specific needs. Help us to set aside any distractions, hurts, or preconceived notions, and give us ears to hear what You want us to receive from our time together. Holy Spirit, guide our discussion and reveal truth to us in ways that transform our hearts and minds. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Share about a time when you discovered you were related to someone you didn't expect, or tell us about an interesting family connection or story from your family history.

# Questions

- 1. What does it mean that 'God has no grandchildren, only children'? How does this challenge the idea that family faith can be inherited?
- 2. The pastor mentioned that some people get excited about their family history while others see broken branches. How has your family background affected your view of being part of God's family?
- 3. What are the practical differences between living with a 'slave mentality' versus living as a 'child of God'?

- 4. How does understanding that you have 'total access to the Father' change the way you approach prayer and your relationship with God?
- 5. The sermon suggests we should 'stop hating the family God gave us.' What are some healthy ways to deal with family hurt while still honoring this principle?
- 6. What does it mean to be 'conformed to the image of His son' rather than trying to avoid becoming like our earthly family members?
- 7. How does knowing you have an eternal inheritance in heaven impact the way you view temporary earthly possessions and struggles?
- 8. The pastor shared about judging someone by their appearance on the airplane. How can we better see people through God's eyes rather than making assumptions based on outward appearances?

### Life Application

This week, practice living as a child of God by choosing one specific area where you've been thinking like a slave (fear, shame, striving for acceptance) and instead declare your identity as God's beloved child. Each morning, remind yourself: 'I am a child of God by adoption. I am chosen, loved, and secure.' When you catch yourself falling into old patterns of fear or shame, return to this truth and approach your heavenly Father with the confidence of a beloved child.
