Summary

In this sermon, Pastor Mike explores the difference between merely believing in God and truly following Jesus Christ. Using statistics showing that while 89% of Americans believe in God, only 66% have made a commitment to Jesus Christ, he emphasizes that genuine faith requires more than intellectual acknowledgment. The sermon focuses on Lydia from Acts 16, a successful businesswoman who was a "God fearer" before encountering Paul and experiencing true conversion to Christianity.
