

Summary

This sermon explores Jesus' baptism and temptation in the wilderness from Mark 1:9-13, demonstrating that Jesus is the Son of God who came to identify with sinners and defeat Satan. Pastor Sigmund emphasizes that Jesus' baptism was not for repentance since He was sinless, but rather to fulfill God's requirement and identify with humanity. The dramatic events at His baptism - heaven being torn open, the Spirit descending like a dove, and the Father's voice declaring His love - confirm Jesus' divine identity. Following His baptism, the Holy Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness where He faced Satan's temptations for 40 days, ultimately defeating the adversary through the authority of God's Word. The pastor concludes that these stories call us to believe in Jesus as the Son of God and trust Him completely, especially when facing our own temptations and spiritual battles.

Intro Prayer

Gracious and loving heavenly Father, we come before You today with grateful hearts, thankful for Your Word and the opportunity to gather together as Your people. As we open our hearts and minds to study the Gospel of Mark, we ask that You would prepare us to receive what You want us to learn today. Questions

- Why do you think Jesus chose to be baptized even though He had no sin to repent of? What does this teach us about His character?
- The sermon mentions that at Jesus' baptism, 'heaven was torn open.' What significance do you see in this dramatic imagery, and what does it reveal about God's heart?
- How does the Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) work together in the baptism account, and what does this teach us about God's nature?
- Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted. Why do you think God allowed His Son to face such intense testing?
- When Satan tempted Jesus, Jesus responded each time with Scripture from Deuteronomy. How can we better prepare ourselves to face temptation with God's Word?
- The pastor mentioned that when facing temptation, we should 'run to Jesus' rather than trying to find the perfect Bible verse. How does this change your approach to spiritual warfare?
- Jesus defeated Satan on 'his home field' in the wilderness. What does this victory mean for us when we face our own spiritual battles?
- The sermon asks, 'Are you taking pleasure in your relationship with Jesus?' How would you honestly answer this question, and what might need to change?

Life Application

This week, when you face temptation, worry, or anxious thoughts, practice immediately running to Jesus instead of trying to handle it on your own. Simply pray, 'Jesus, take this thought captive' or 'Jesus, help me in this moment.' Keep a journal of how He responds to these prayers and notice how this changes your approach to spiritual battles.

Key Takeaways
